MRC Activities and Improvements

We have developed a draft Sheltering Simulation class that we will be using drill local sheltering plans by reviewing and holding the training at the shelter location in the communities that hold the training and this will give that community an opportunity to drill their sheltering plans and to train volunteers by actually walking through and simulating the shelter in that community.

Region 4A Web-page Improvements:

We have really beefed up our MRC web-page we have set up a registration system for residents that are eligible for the H1N1 vaccine can pre-register for it on the web-page, this has saved the overall time that the health departments are spending pre-registering people who can receive the vaccine. We have made many improvements to the registration system and it has been very instrumental in keeping the flow of the clinics at a steady pace and reducing surges during the clinics. Please take advantage of this web-based registration system.

We are using Survey monkey to help us have MRC volunteers pre-register for a position to help out at their flu clinics, this is working very well.

We have developed a Deployment tool for the web-page and it worked very well during the water distribution deployment.

Region 4A H1N1 Sheltering Team:

We have recruited over 380 MRC volunteers that are willing to help out state wide with the shelter operations during the spring floods we have compiled a list of additional staff that can assist inside and outside of their communities, it is worked very well during this recent deployment. We will use this team to drill our new sheltering class simulation a regional shelter.
